Guidelines for Term papers / Master Global History

Term paper (8 ECTS)

20 to 25 pages

Please send a pdf-file via email and – if you are in Germany – a printed version via normal mail.

Use academic language, no colloquial language. Define the concepts you use – with the help of secondary sources, encyclopedias, dictionaries. Distinguish carefully between emic/etic perspectives that is the language of your historical sources and the language of the secondary literature.

Please produce a clear research question and coherent argument that runs through the entire term paper. The introduction starts with your research question(s), provides context and how you are going to answer your research question. In the main sections, you develop your argument. In the conclusions, you pointedly show how you answered your question.

Please do not use long quotations from primary sources or the secondary literature. Provide a discussion of primary and secondary sources.

You term papers needs a bibliography (primary and secondary sources) with a sufficient number of titles. Please organise these alphabetically (the last name comes first). Secondary sources need to be academic publications (they have footnotes). The bibliography contains all primary sources and the secondary sources used in your text. All references of the footnotes go into the bibliography while the bibliography contains no titles that are not used (footnotes!) in the text.

Formal structure of the Term paper

Front page

Lecturer, title of the course, semester of the course (e.g. Winter Term 2023/24), topic of the paper, name of the author, study program & semester of the author, module for which the paper should be credited, email address, date of submission of the paper.

Table of contents (max. 3 outline levels)

Main text

- o Introduction (topic, aim, method, state of research and sources)
- o Main part (with several sub-sections this is about your own examination of the sources and research literature regarding your term paper topic)
- o Conclusion (analysis/evaluation/presentation of the results and any open questions and problems or outlook)

Bibliography/List of sources and literature

Please quote Internet sources with reference to the website and the date you last accessed the website. Please only use academic websites.

Formal design

- White Din A 4 paper, printed only on one side
- Page numbers

- ➤ 12-pt font Times New Roman
- ➤ 18-pt line spacing
